Crochet raven/crow pattern by TNGiftsUA

Thank you for choosing our pattern. I hope it will bring you a lot of fun. The creation process is not as complex as it seems at first glance. You just need to carefully follow all of the instructions below and at the end you get a raven like that.

It is easy to put him on the desk or on the nightstand in the room. I think everyone can think of where to use the crow.

The allocated framework will have additional tips to simplify the work.

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You need for work:

- such colors of yarn: **black** Kartopu 4 Mevsim for body and paws (100g/360m , fiber content 50%cotton/50% acrylic) ;
Yarn weight – **Sport - Fine**
- **gray** for beak Alize Lana Gold 800 (100g/800m , 51% acrylic/49% wool) ;
Yarn weight – **Lace**



Yarn weight look at the picture below (Yarn Weights Chart). You can use yarn of any composition that you have, but take into account the thickness. If the yarn is very thin, then the crow will be small. If the yarn is very thick, then the crow will be larger than indicated in my pattern.

- **hook 2,1 and 1,15 mm** Look at the picture below (Crochet Hook Conversion Chart);








You can use hooks 2 and 1. Everything will depend on the density of your crocheting.

- thread for stitching parts;
- needle and scissors;
- 2 half-beads or 2 beads (d = 3-5mm);
- copper wire Ø0,3mm;

You can take the wire thicker. I used the one that I had

- transparent glue or PVA;
- poly material for stuffing and a great imagination!))





Pattern notes

You will be crocheting in **spirals**.

When finished, raven/crow is roughly 19 cm (7,48") tall if you take the same yarn.

You can use another yarn, but the finished product may differ in size.

Body (black yarn) take 2,1 mm hook. Starting from head.

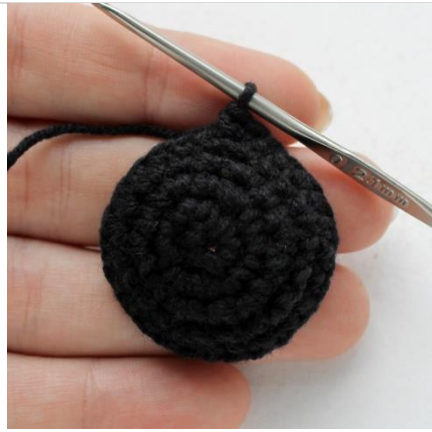

Rnd 3:	Sc 1, inc; rep 6 times	(18)	39
Rnd 4:	Sc 2, inc; rep 6 times	(24)	40
Rnd 5:	Sc 3, inc; rep 6 times	(30)	41
Rnd 6:	Sc 4, inc; rep 6 times	(36)	42
Rnd 7:	Sc 18, sl st		43-44

All the rows are crochet with *back loop*.

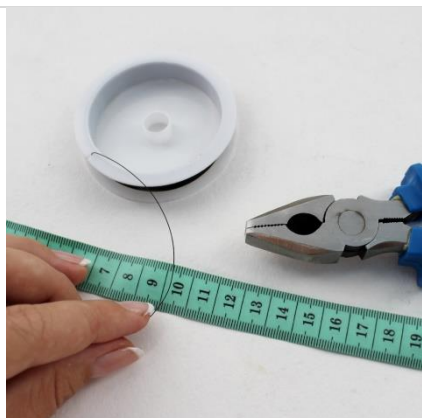


Anatomy of raven's feet for our work)

We will make a similar construction of the paws

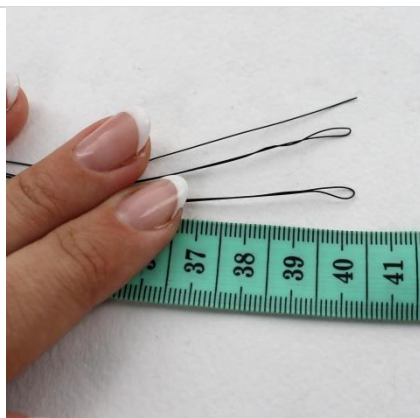
We take copper wire ($\varnothing 0,3\text{mm}$),

- pliers,
- length measuring device,
- glue,
- yarn for paws,
- scissors.



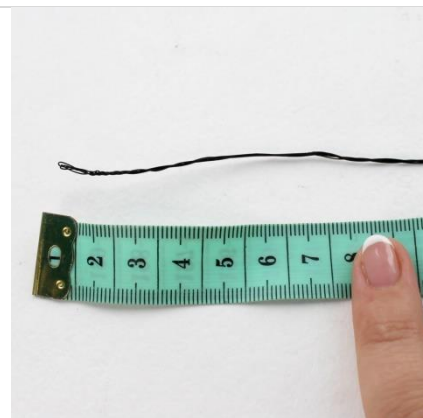

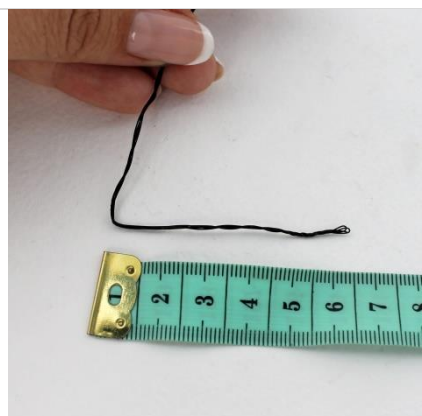

We take copper wire ($\varnothing 0,3\text{mm}$) in 5 pieces. Length about 40cm



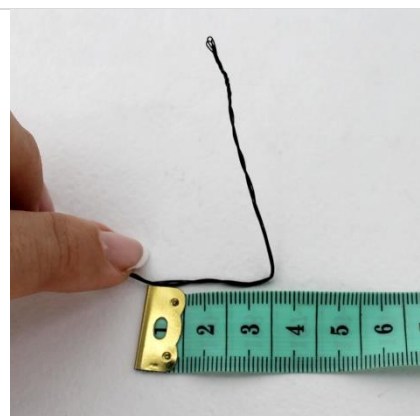

We twist the wire around its axis so that it keeps the shape well

We measure the length of 6cm/2,36". This is the length from Knee to Ankle

Than we measure the length of 3cm/1,18". This is the length from Ankle to Toes

Create raven's toes. Length of toe 3cm/1,18"



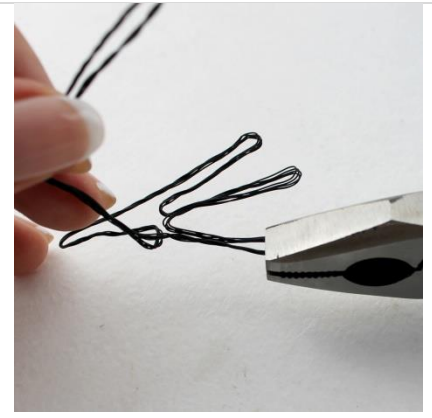

Sew the hip to the foot in a circle

The raven's feet should be stable so that they can withstand the weight of the body.

If necessary, you can take 6 or 7 fibers of wire.

BEAK (Gray yarn and hook 1,15mm) Beak consist of two part

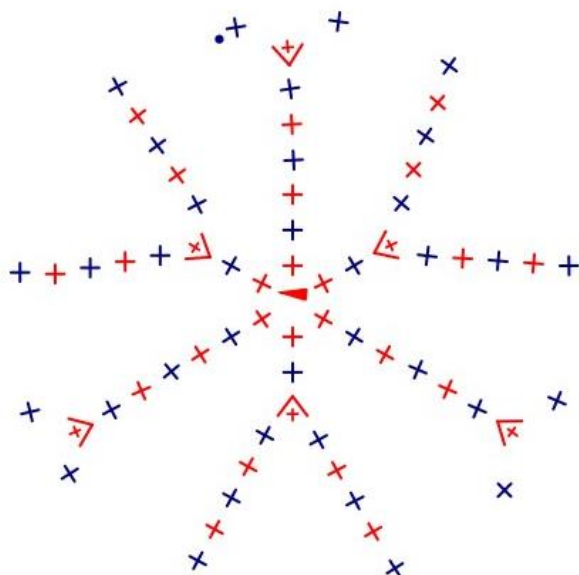

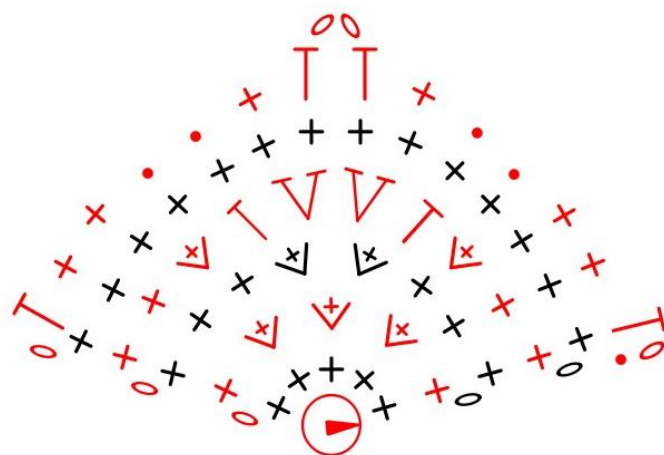

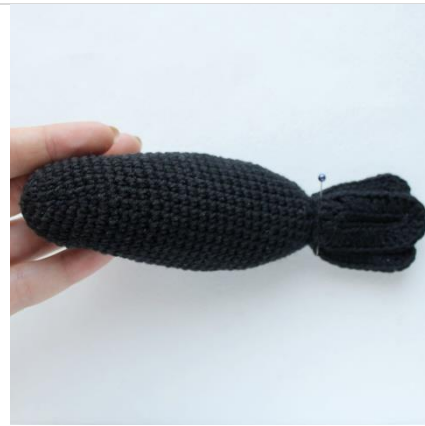
