



Simple Scarf for Men (or women!)

Needing a quick, simple project for a man (or woman!) in your life? This scarf works up super quickly, features a simple two-stitch repeat and is uber warm. Make it as narrow or as wide as you like, and since we are working up the width of the scarf, simply stop when you've reached desired length. Scarves can be anywhere from 55" to 85" or longer, so I recommend stopping every so often to test.

Materials:

[Big Twist Chunky Yarn](#) in Slate (two skeins)

[Crochet hook](#) in size M/N



Notes:

This scarf can be as wide or as narrow as you want it to be, as we are simply repeating the same two stitches throughout. To alter this pattern, you could start with less (or more) chains if you wish it to be more narrow (or more wide). The only rule to changing size: make sure that your chain ends on an ODD number and then follow the rest of the pattern below.

Pictured is about 9" wide and about 60" long.

Gauge:

Unimportant.

Pattern:

Row 1: Ch-25. Sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next. *sc in next, dc in next* to end of row. Ch-1, turn.

Row 2: Sc in first (same as ch), dc in next. *sc in next, dc in next* to end.

in this row and all following rows the sc and dc stitches are offset, meaning you'll sc in the dcs from the previous row and dc in the scs from previous row to create textured effect

When desired length is reached, fasten off and weave in ends. Clip some of the remainder of your yarn into 12" strands. Taking three strands at a time, add fringe to every sc opening in the end of the scarf as pictured. Trim the fringe to be uniform *annnnnd* you're done! Easy, right?
