

LW4714 $\square \square$ crochet

What you will need: RED HEART ${ }^{\ominus}$ Medley ${ }^{\text {"': }} 4(4,5,6)$ balls 934 Energy

Susan Bates ${ }^{\bullet}$ Crochet Hooks: 6.5 mm [US K-10.5] and 8 mm [US L-11]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: 2 pattern repeats = $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}(14 \mathrm{~cm})$ (one pattern repeat consists of 4 back post stitches plus one V-stitch); 6 rows $=4^{\prime \prime}$ ( 10 cm ) with larger hook. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## Buy Yarn

RED HEART ${ }^{\circ}$ Medley"' Art E824, available in $40 z$ (113g), 86 yds ( 78 m ) ball


## Cowl Shoulder Cozy

Wonderful color shadings blend easily with your wardrobe for an accessory you'll depend on for keeping shoulders warm. Easy sizing makes this the perfect crocheted gift!

## Directions are for size Small. Changes for sizes Medium, Large, and Extra Large are in parentheses.

Cozy measures 44 (48, 52, 56)" [112 (122 $132,142) \mathrm{cm}$ ] circumference at bust and arms x 13" ( 33 cm ) long.

## Special Stitches

Bpdc (back post double crochet) = Yarn over, insert hook from back side of work to front and to back again around the post of indicated stitch; yarn over and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 2 loops (2 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 2 loops ( 1 loop on hook). Skip the stitch "in front of" the Bpdc. Fpdc (Front post double crochet) = Yarn over, insert hook from front side of work to back and to front again around post of indicated stitch; yarn over and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 2 loops (2 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 2 loops ( 1 loop on hook).
V-st $(\mathbf{V}$-stitch $)=(h d c$, ch 1, hdc) in indicated stitch or space.

## Notes

1. Cozy is worked in 2 sections. Capelet (lower section) is worked back and forth in rows then seamed to form a tube. Cowl (upper section) is worked in joined rounds.
2. The circumference of the capelet alone will be larger than the finished measurements. The ribbed cowl will cause the top of the capelet to narrow.
3. With a tape measure, measure around wearer's bust over the arms and work size that is closest to this measurement.

## COZY

Capelet
With larger hook, ch 27 .
Row 1: Dc in 3rd ch from the hook
(beginning ch do not count as a st), dc in next 3 ch, *skip next ch, V-st in next ch, skip next ch, dc in next 4 ch; repeat from * across, turn -16 dc and 3 V -sts.
Row 2 (right side): Ch 2 (does not count as a st here or throughout), Fpdc around first $4 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} \mathrm{~V}$-st in ch-1 space of next V -st, Fpdc around next 4 dc ; repeat from * across, turn- 16 Fpdc and 3 V -sts.
Row 3: Ch 2, Bpdc around first 4 Fpdc, *V-st in ch- 1 space of next $V$-st, Bpdc around next 4 Fpdc; repeat from * across, turn-16 Bpdc and 3 V -sts.
Row 4: Ch 2, Fpdc around first 4 Bpdc, *V-st in ch-1 space of next V-st, Fpdc around next 4 Bpdc; repeat from * across, turn.
Rows 5-70 (76, 82, 88): Repeat last 2 rows $33(36,39,42)$ times.
Fasten off, leaving a $24^{\prime \prime}(61 \mathrm{~cm})$ tail for sewing. With wrong sides held together, whipstitch first and last rows together.

## Cowl

Hold capelet with right side facing and continue in joined rounds.
Round 1 (right side): With smaller hook and working in ends of rows, join yarn with slip st in first row, ch 2, dc in same row as join and in each row around; join with slip st in first dc-70 $(76,82,88)$ dc.

Continued...


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Round 2: Ch 2, Fpdc around first dc, Bpdc around next dc, *Fpdc around next dc, Bpdc around next dc; repeat from * around; join with slip st in first Fpdc-35 $(38,41,44)$ Fpdc and $35(38,41,44)$ Bpdc.
Round 3-7: Ch 2, Fpdc around first Fpdc, Bpdc around next Bpdc, *Fpdc around next Fpdc, Bpdc around next Bpdc; repeat from * around; join with slip st in first Fpdc. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends.

## ABBREVIATIONS

$\mathbf{c h}=$ chain; $\mathbf{d c}=$ double crochet; $\mathbf{h d c}=$ half double crochet; st(s) = stitch(es); ( ) = work directions in parentheses in same st; * $=$ repeat whatever follows the * as indicated.
